

Federal judge orders Mahmoud Khalil's case to continue in NJ

"Last week, a federal court in New York ruled that the case challenging ICE's unlawful detention of Mahmoud Khalil, a recent Columbia graduate student and lawful permanent resident, should be transferred to New Jersey. The Trump administration had sought to transfer the case to Louisiana, where they moved him 1,400 miles from his family and legal team after his habeas case was filed. The new judge overseeing his case in New Jersey reaffirmed a previous order that blocked Mr. Khalil's deportation.

"This is a first step, but we need to continue to demand justice for Mahmoud. His unlawful and unjust detention cannot stand. We will not stop fighting until he is home with me," said Mr. Khalil's wife, Dr. Noor Abdalla, who is eight months pregnant.

In a <u>letter</u> written from the Louisiana detention center, Mr. Khalil shared: "In the weeks ahead, students, advocates, and elected officials must unite to defend the right to protest for Palestine. At stake are not just our

voices, but the fundamental civil liberties of all. Knowing fully that this moment transcends my individual circumstances, I hope nonetheless to be free to witness the birth of my first-born child."

The case can now proceed expeditiously to two pending motions that seek Mr. Khalil's release from custody.


"I envy the Palestinians. Not for what they're going through, obviously, but for what they have. Their supremely authentic culture, with its deep roots and ancient connection to the land.





Grounding our Purpose

The National Black Radical Organizing Conference will be held May 30



"The Second National Black Radical Organizing Conference (NBROC) continues the legacy of Black radical resistance, uniting organizers to confront imperialism, capitalism, and white supremacy while building an independent path toward collective liberation. The gathering in Indiana - 53 years after the historic National Black Political Convention - reaffirms that our freedom lies not in reforming a broken system but in dismantling it and forging a revolutionary future.

In March 1972, on the heels of the Black Freedom Movement, nearly ten thousand Black people, including organizers, activists, politicians, and artists, convened in Gary, Indiana, for the National Black Political Convention (NBPC). Similar to today, they faced the failure of the two-party duopoly, rising inflation, growing economic crisis, an unpopular imperialist war, counterattacks on our movements, and a pressing need for political clarity. Among the NBPC's goals was to build an independent Black Agenda. While they achieved this goal by producing a National Black Agenda, class and ideological factions ultimately weakened the ability to organize around it. Thus, the appetite for political clarity and strategy sought at the '72 conference still eats at us as we meet in Indiana 53 years later.

The Second National Black Radical Organizing Conference (NBROC) is an attempt, as many have done before us, to create a space to discuss, debate, train, assess, and create a collective way forward for Black/African/New Afrikan organizations and organizers who believe that our struggle for self-determination is paramount to our survival. We understand that without organized political power, we will not collectively achieve affordable

housing, an environmentally sustainable planet, life-affirming education, land sovereignty, food justice, and economic security. We do not look to be integrated, assimilated, or incorporated into America but to liberate ourselves from it. By Any Means Necessary!

The Black Radical Tradition- the opposition to empire, imperialism, patriarchy, and capitalism as we fight for self-determination- is under attack, and we must fight back. Our enemies are working hard to appropriate and neutralize our historical traditions, symbols, and narratives of resistance. This was on full display at the Democratic National Convention and throughout the ill-fated Harris Campaign, where many of our symbols and s/heros, like Fannie Lou Hamer, Frantz Fanon, and W.E.B DuBois, were grossly misappropriated to support their imperialist agenda and justify the ongoing genocide of the Palestinian people. The Republicans and their ilk are no better, as their overt white nationalist stance presents a clear and present danger to our people. Going forward, our movement must draw some clear lines in the sand against the two parties of imperialism and the notion that engaging the two-party system is the only legitimate path to accomplish our goals.

We are clear that our enemy is organized. They invade us for charting our own path, imprison us for defending ourselves against them, starve us for profits, expel us for questioning their history, and deprive our bodies of freedom for exercising our own choices. They are organized through military budgets, campaign contributions, banking institutions, governmental laws, and media propaganda. Capitalism, imperialism, white supremacy, and patriarchy are nothing but expressions of an organized enemy. An enemy that has left us bargaining for crumbs each election cycle.

The first National Black Radical Organizing Conference (NBROC) was convened in Atlanta in June 2023. We aim for BROC to serve as a place for an ongoing collective process to provide greater political clarity for our movement and our people. We need to make it clear that to be a Black Radical is to be a revolutionary and that being a revolutionary means being committed to the struggle to end capitalism, white supremacy, colonialism, imperialism, and patriarchy. It means building for our collective liberation by developing our institutions to construct a socialist future through organizing the Black working class, building new social movement trade unions that serve the interests of our people, independent Black political power, participatory democracy, solidarity economics, and ecologically regenerative practices to situate us in the right relationship with Mother Earth. To be successful, our praxis - theory and practice - must be dialectical and material. We must have a solid class analysis and a deep understanding of dynamic and generative culture that constantly returns us to our African source(s) and moves us forward towards a love supreme.

Therefore, we will gather to forge an independent base beyond the two-party duopoly. We insist that we must advance clear revolutionary nationalist, Pan-African, and internationalist perspectives. Our liberation will not come from trying to reform American institutions or political parties. It will be born out of defeating US imperialism and dismantling the systems of capitalism, colonialism, patriarchy, and white supremacy—nothing short of it.

At this conference, we will help organizers further establish the skills to build a base beyond the duopoly. We will sharpen our methods of strategy, hone our communication skills, refine our ethics, strengthen our analysis, identify our needs, and bring new people along with us.

Despite its many shortcomings, the 1972 National Black Political Convention provided a space to activate political imagination. We are organizing this conference to give our people the space to enter and grow. We recognize that everyone enters the struggle at their own level with the ambition to contribute more. Here, we want to nurture that ambition because we can win only with the masses' invigorated participation!

The National Black Radical Organizing Conference will be held May 30 - June 1st at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. It is sponsored by representatives Black Alliance for Peace, Community Movement Builders, National Black Liberation Movement, Black Men Build, Malcolm X Grassroots Movement, Cooperation Jackson, and more to be announced. Registration is now open."


Help Muhammad Rebuild After Truck Fire

"Greetings of Peace. My name is Jihad Abdulmumit, whom many of you already know. I am fundraising on behalf of my brother-in-law in Cameroon, Muhammad Nassaraddine. (My wife and I have an apartment here where I stay when not in the U.S.). Muhammad is an excellent truck mechanic and has had his own business fixing Mercedes Benz trucks for the last ten years. On or about Sunday, March 2, 2025, Muhammad sent his

apprentice to repair a truck. That night the truck caught fire. The owner was furious and now Muhammad must pay \$8,500 for the cost of the burnt truck. In Cameroon, there is no "investigation" like in the United States to accurately determine the cause of the fire. So, the unconfirmed assumption is that the apprentice crossed the electrical wires, and a fire started overnight that consumed the entire cab of the truck. Minus any apparatus for investigation, the consequence is to restrict Muhammad's ability and opportunity to work and provide for his family until his debt is paid. From the United States I know full well that most of us are in some type of financial stress and in need of assistance. But, respectfully and prayerfully, I am throwing my hat in the milieu of social media and crowd sourcing requests to assist my family here in Cameroon get over this potentially family destabilizing dilemma. Dr. Abdalla speaks on the importance of continuing the struggle amidst Trump's ongoing and escalating repression. Mahmoud, who has been detained for 25 days now, was targeted in a politically motivated detention that sought to make an example out of his vocal opposition to the genocide and occupation of his homeland. She issued a clear call to action: "The time to show up is now. I urge you to take a bus, take a car, take a plane or take a train and show up at 1:00 p.m. We need to show up in large numbers and make it known that the people will never consent to the massacre in Gaza." 





He is also a veteran of the Black Panther Party, wrongfully convicted when the FBI, in their efforts to recapture Assata Shakur, convinced Atlanta police to reopen a 30-year-old cold case murder of a Fulton County police officer, and charge Mr. Sadiki.

The police told Kamau that if he worked with them and "got Assata to leave Cuba" and go to some other country where they could apprehend her, they would not prosecute on the false police killing charge. The police offer was rejected, and Kamau, now serving a Life plus 10 years sentence, has always maintained his innocence. Kamau Sadiki is now 70 and in poor health with Hepatitis C, cirrhosis of the liver, blood pressure issues, open infectious wounds and sarcoidosis. Every day is a struggle for him, and for his two daughters and grandchildren, who are devastated by the absence of their loving, hard-working father and grandfather, who supported them by working for the telephone company in New York for over eighteen years. "About The Freedom Archives

The Freedom Archives contains over 10,000 hours of audio and video tapes which date from the late-1960s to the mid-90s and chronicle the progressive history of the Bay Area, the United States, and international

movements. We are also in the process of scanning and uploading thousands of historical documents which enrich our media holdings. Our collections include weekly news, poetry, music programs; in-depth interviews and reports on social and cultural issues; numerous voices from behind prison walls; diverse activists; and pamphlets, journals and other materials from many radical organizations and movements.

These materials constitute a compelling record of 50 years of recorded sound, images and cultural diversity. The music/poetry mixes, production techniques, and sound collages represent an innovative contribution to the art of radio and the cultural ambiance of "the 60s" and subsequent decades.

Among our collections include an extensive materials on La Raza centering around audio tapes about Latino culture, community and news from independent producers Jesse 'Chuy' Varela—now at KCSM—and Pajaro Latino by Jorge Herera at KPOO (a program that continues to this day). We also hold a comprehensive collection of the radio work of the late Colin Edwards—who produced programs for the BBC, Canadian Broadcasting, Irish Radio, and Pacifica Radio about everything from the Black Power Movement to Vietnam and the Middle East.

The Freedom Archives also contains exclusive material on the civil rights, student, antiwar, prison, women's, and LGBTQI movements along with broad collections on the Puerto Rican independence struggle, political prisoners and in-depth reports on key events from San Francisco to South Africa.

Lessons of the Recent Past

There is an overwhelming need for the young people of today to have access to non-filtered, non-biased educational resources that allow them to learn more about our recent history. Young people need to know about and understand the aims, events, accomplishments and setbacks of those influential times. The archives and projects growing from the collection can help satisfy a growing interest by youth of many cultures in these social and cultural currents, and can assist them in unearthing lessons of the recent past even as they raise new concerns of their own. Educational programs utilizing multifaceted audio resources can convey recent history to high school and college students in dramatic ways that cut through the stereotypical depictions of textbooks, the mainstream media, and commercialized mass culture.

Educational Resources

The collection is not only an invaluable resource to young people and students, but also to teachers, diverse community organizations and media outlets, filmmakers, activists, historians, artists and researchers. In efforts to encourage younger generations to explore our many social justice collections, we've launched a digital search engine that is media-sample-driven and allows for a less academic and more user-friendly exploration of our materials. You can access the search engine at search.freedomarchives.org. There are also resources including video clips and curriculum on our blog.

We are also in the process of developing historical curricula based on primary sources, often misrepresented by textbooks and popularized history.

Preservation

We need your help to preserve these invaluable historical materials! Many of our older audio and video formats have begun to deteriorate and aspects of our paper collection also need attention. Without preservation, the very existence of these materials as a vital resource for young people and future generations will be lost. On a shoestring, with largely volunteer labor, we have assembled the equipment and facilities to begin both the data base classification of the materials and the re-mastering of the collection. Internships

Our youth internship program will ensure that young people also play a crucial role in these tasks while benefiting educationally, technically, and in their future pathways and careers. "We are being exterminated," women said as they describe the prolonged suffering, deadly violence and terror, widespread rape, torture and kidnappings, burning of homes, schools and businesses, displacement, escalating prices, lack of food, water, medicine, and work brought about by death squads tied to right-wing sectors of the government and Haitian elite. And armed with weapons imported from the US and Dominican Republic.

"Children are growing up in an environment in which they have nothing," they said. "What happened to <u>Eliana Telemaque</u> [the Haitian mother who died of a broken-heart after she was forced to watch her two-month old infant be burned alive by death squads] is emblematic of what women throughout Haiti are enduring."

In an earlier International Women's Day statement released by the Women's Interdepartmental Coalition of Haiti, women wrote: "Our children cannot go to school, they are burning down our homes, schools, hospitals, pharmacies and laboratories. We condemn how in 2004, the US, France, Canada and other countries were quick to send forces to Haiti when there was none of this chaos. We see where they have brought Haiti after 21 years of occupation, when they overthrew a popular and democratic government...We are asking for international solidarity to prosecute the criminals, who are financing the gangs in Haiti. We must expose these thieves wherever we find them in Haiti and abroad. We also condemn the US and the Dominican Republic for supplying all the weapons and ammunition that are terrorizing the Haitian people."

The Spirit of Mandela Coalition & the Peoples' Senate Organizing Committee

DID YOU KNOW that in 2021, the U.S was found GUILTY of five accounts of genocide against Black, Brown, and Indigenous people??

Dear Friend and Fellow Freedom Fighter,

The Spirit of Mandela Coalition, following up on the October 2021 International Tribunal verdict finding the US Guilty of Genocide against Black, Brown, and Indigenous people (see full verdict <u>HERE</u>), is calling for the building of a new mass grassroots formation: The Peoples' Senate. The people need to govern and represent

themselves in combating genocide and addressing their right to a just and humane existence. Our vision is for the Peoples' Senate, organized directly by our oppressed communities, to grow into a body which will serve that purpose.

Today our communities face the most egregious violations of our human rights since the civil rights and Black power movements of the 1960s and '70s. Conditions we are living under include random mass shootings, rightwing vigilante attacks, police violence and murder, environmental racism, the reassertion of "states rights" (the "right" of states to ignore basic human rights), and healthcare racism. The US government dangerously scapegoats immigrants; causes destabilization, extreme violence, bombing, and killing of Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people all over the globe – and spends billions of dollars to do it; and keeps hundreds of thousands of people living in homelessness and poverty in the US. Our communities are facing targeted attacks against voting rights, workers' rights, women's rights, and Indigenous Peoples' rights as right-wing elected officials and appointed judges roll back decades of hard-won battles for justice. While out-voting right-wing candidates during elections is important, voting alone will not be enough. We must organize to put more pressure on the system for major change.

The US Congress and Senate are representatives of the rich and powerful. They refuse to address the necessity for universal healthcare or a sound nationwide infrastructure providing access to clean water and other necessities. Corporations ignore and violate the needs of the planet while evading their fair share of taxes. US prisons are filled with Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people, many incarcerated for crimes they did not commit and/or serving sentences that far outweigh whatever criminal acts they may have committed. The oppressed national communities of Black, Brown, and Indigenous peoples all have political prisoners and prisoners of war incarcerated since the 1960s until today, who have fought for our liberation and are being held in prison unjustly or only released when near death. We want them all freed now!

Building our own Peoples' Senate will enable us to organize locally from a position of strength and connect local activists with others, in other parts of the country, who may be pursuing similar goals while electing "Senators" who are mandated to represent our interests and demands. A Peoples' Senate can fight for changes that protect and ensure our right to vote, our right to control our own bodies, our right to live free from discrimination as LGBTQ+ people, our rights to living wages and safe working conditions, our rights to sovereignty and dignity, and our rights to live free from state violence and abuse.
